Grade Eight

This is an abstinence based program that will be taught by a Health and Physical Education Teacher who has been trained to provide information and answer questions about these topics. It will be their job to build upon the knowledge that the student has already learned from the previous grade. There will be presentations of factual and age appropriate information to students in gender separated classes.

OBJECTIVE

8.1 The student will review the reproductive systems and be able to explain the process of fertilization through birth and factors associated with development.

CONTENT

- II. Review the process of fertilization through birth
- III. Risk factors associated with teen pregnancy
- IV. Heredity
- V. Birth defects

OBJECTIVE

8.2 The student will identify basic facts about sexually transmitted infections, focusing on complications and behavior.

CONTENT

- III. Explanation and prevention of HIV/ AIDS

OBJECTIVE

8.3 The student will analyze the issues and consequences related to teenage sexual activity and teenage pregnancy.

8.4 The student will be able to discuss abuse and violence in relationships as it relates to date rape, club and designer drugs. (Electronic Harassment)
